


Without Project: Existing Route in Orange

### Questions, Comments, Concerns?

Does the project add significant trackage, such as added tracks to Alameda Corridor? No.

When would the project be constructed? The ACTA Board needs to approve, then within 6-12 months.

Have you analyzed air quality impacts associated with the project? Do you measure the pollution from trains that is constantly imposed on our community? ACTA quantifies the benefits of corridor operations compared to precorridor conditions. Qualitatively, this project will improve emissions by removing diamond crossings that cause locomotive idling and at-grade crossings that cause truck idling.

Has there been a study of impacts to the community? The project is expected to benefit the community by moving trains further from Wilmington, reducing locomotive idling, reducing truck idling and improving roadway safety.

Will the project be used by both Ports? Yes.

How is this project related to Pier B? Are the projects connected? This project is not connected nor related to Pier B. The project benefits stand with our without Pier B.
